

Navajo Weaving Workshop
Northern Arizona University, Flagstaff, AZ

August 1 - 5, 2011

A five day workshop that will cover weaving techniques in making a Navajo rug. The course will cover setting up the warp, attaching edging & side cords and heddles, and finally the basic weaving techniques but not limited to this. The instructor will also include the raised outline technique and other tricks of the trade that are not found in books. On the last day of the workshop participants will experience the finishing of a rug and the finishing touches!! An overview of the history of Navajo weaving and rugs will also be covered throughout the workshop which includes the shearing, carding, spinning, and dyeing of wool.

Participants will have their own loom to take home at the end of the workshop with a finished rug.

Cost/Tuition: \$495.00 per person

Material Fee: \$110.00 (Includes the loom, edging & side cords, warp, weft, and material/tools needed for the week)

NOTE: Instructor will have extra wool and weaving tools available for sale
